On this album, being released on June 22, the ever-adventurous pianist Marilyn Crispell is found in quietly exploratory improvised duets with clarinetist David Rothenberg (in his ECM debut). Rothenberg studied with Jimmy Giuffre and Joe Maneri, amongst others, and is active as a player-composer and is also well known as an author and naturalist. His books include *Why Birds Sing* and *Thousand Mile Song* (an investigation of the music of whales), and the song titles here reflect on the natural world. Tracks include "The Hawk and the Mouse," "Owl Moon," and "Still Life with Woodpeckers."
